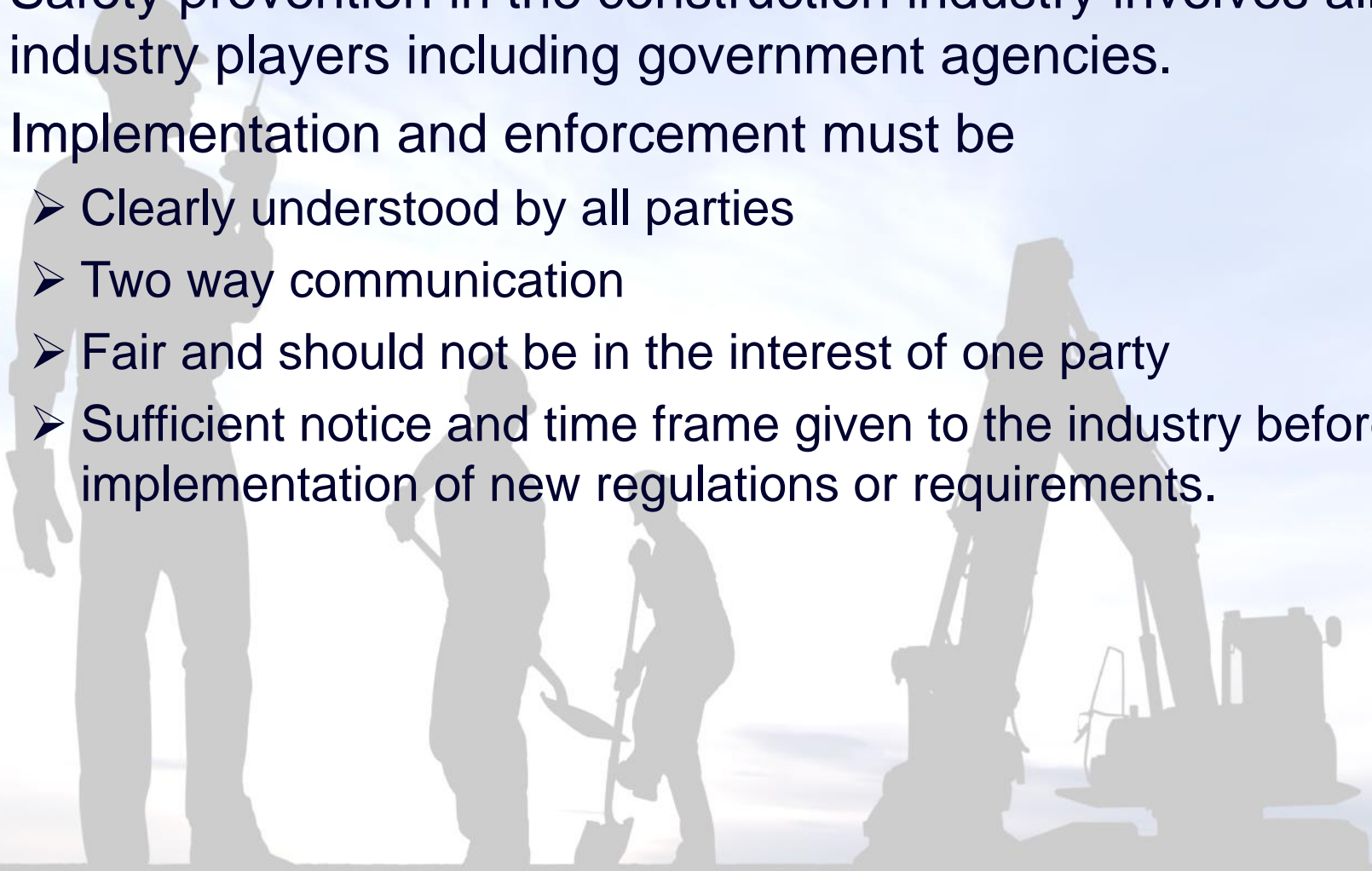


COOPERATION WITH GOVERNMENT AGENCIES AND INDUSTRY PLAYERS
